

So That All May Hear



Nearly 2 in 1,000 babies are born each year with congenital hearing loss, making it one of the most commonly occurring birth defects (CDC). For many parents, this is further complicated by the high cost of pediatric hearing aids. We believe that no child should be denied hearing aids based on an inability to pay. For families living in Georgia, there is hope and a resource: The Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation.

Our Pediatric Hearing Program offers high quality, affordable access to Georgia families who are uninsured, underinsured and fall between the gaps in Medicaid, PeachCare and the federal limit for families receiving subsidies or tax credits.

Services available for pediatric hearing patients (birth-19-years-old) include:

- · Up to 2 digital hearing aids, or BAHA soft band
- · 12 earmolds (bilateral loss); 6 earmolds (unilateral loss)
- · 9 appointments with a Lighthouse Hearing Provider
- · 3-year repair warranty; 3-year loss and damage warranty

Referral Network

Patients may be referred through a speech language pathologist, an audiologist, school social workers, parents, friends, etc. Patients and their families can also download the application from the Lighthouse website: www.lionslighthouse.org/childrens-hearing-programs/.

Program Requirements

- Birth 19 years old
- Family income up to 400% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (up to \$8,083 monthly income for a household of four)
- One parent/guardian must be a Georgia resident for at least one year
- · Uninsured or insurance denial for hearing aids
- · Birth certificate or valid Georgia ID card
- Must have a current audiogram (more than 3 months old)
- Must be a patient of an approved Lighthouse
 Foundation provider

Funding & Partnerships

The Pediatric Hearing Program is made possible through a partnership between the Georgia Commission on Hearing, The Georgia Public Service Commission, and the advocacy group Let Georgia Hear.

With their support the Lighthouse was chosen as the model for implementation. The Pediatric Hearing Program launched January 1, 2015 and aims to serve 100 children each year.
