These are audiologists who could test my hearing. They are very nice and want to make sure I can hear.



When it's my turn, I will sit in the soundbooth. There is a thick door, but I'm not afraid because I can have a grown up go in the booth with me.





There is a big window so I can see the audiologist. It is very quiet in the soundbooth.



The audiologist will shine a light and look into my ears. It may tickle a little, but it will not hurt.





The audiologist needs to take a picture of the inside of my ear. She puts a tiny ear bud in my ear, and then we look at the picture on the screen.




Next, the audiologist will put headphones on my ears. This is so I can listen for the beep.
